THE SCREEN HOUSE

A study in shelter, transparency and filtered light.

A HOUSE OF LAYERS

SOLID AT THE EDGES. OPEN WITHIN.

The Screen House is composed as a sequence of protective and transparent layers. Brick grounds the home, dark masonry gives it weight, and a glazed centre opens daily life toward the garden and mountain landscape.

01 A clear arrival

A long brick datum and circular steel screen give the approach an immediate identity.

02 A transparent centre

The double-height glazed volume connects the two wings and brings nature into the elevation.

03 A tactile palette

Weathered steel, red brick, dark masonry, timber and glass balance weight and permanence.

THE COMPOSITION

A HOME READ IN THREE PARTS.

Two grounded wings are joined by a luminous central volume. A circular screen interrupts the long horizontal line, marking the transition and giving the house its defining silhouette.



01 / HORIZONTAL DATUM

Brick wall, low roofline and planted forecourt establish calm, legible proportions.



02 / VERTICAL MARKER

The steel screen and chimney create a memorable counterpoint.



01 / THE ARRIVAL

A CLEAR FIRST IMPRESSION.

The driveway view introduces the home in one glance: timber, brick, dark masonry, glass and the circular steel screen. The composition feels welcoming without reducing the architecture to simple front elevation.

IDENTITY IN THE DETAIL.

The perforated weathered-steel screen is more than a facade element. It is the project's visual signature – filtering light, creating privacy and giving every wider view a recognisable rhythm.

03 / THE HEART OF THE HOUSE

LIGHT CONNECTS THE LEVELS.

A double-height glazed centre makes the stair and dining area part of the exterior composition. The view explains how the red-brick wings, chimney and transparent centre work together.



WHAT THE CLIENT CAN UNDERSTAND

Spatial connection. Natural light. Material hierarchy. The relationship between house and garden.



04 / MATERIAL & ART

TACTILE. PERSONAL. MEMORABLE.

Editorial close-ups slow the story down. Brick irregularity, masonry, steel patina, glass and the wall-mounted artwork provide the project a human scale that wide views alone cannot provide.

05 / ENTRY SEQUENCE

ARRIVAL BECOMES A MOMENT.

At the threshold, the house becomes more intimate. Timber softens the darker structural surfaces, plants bring movement to the foreground, and the circular screen remains visible as an orientation point.

SPATIAL CHARACTER

Sheltered / tactile / legible / calm

SET INTO THE LAND, NOT ABOVE IT.

Low rooflines and deep planting keep the architecture visually connected to the ground. Beyond the house, the mountain horizon extends the composition and gives the arrival a sense of place.

LANDSCAPE ROLE

Frame the approach. Soften the material palette. Connect the house to the wider terrain.

07 / DAYLIGHT & TRANSPARENCY

LIGHT REVEALS HOW THE HOUSE WORKS.

Across the day, glazing turns the central space into a
layer of reflection, view and occupation.

Opaque and transparent. Sheltered and open. Textured and reflective.

08 / BLUE HOUR

THE HOUSE BECOMES A LANTERN.

As daylight falls, the central glazing becomes luminous and the material hierarchy grows stronger. Brick and weathered steel hold the foreground while warm interior light reveals the life of the house within.

NIGHT CHARACTER

Warm / grounded / private / quietly expressive
